Fall Faith Formation 2020

It comes as no surprise that this fall will not look like anything Crown of Glory has experienced before. In total honesty, I look back on the conversations among staff members in March when Minnesota experienced the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic with amusement because at that point, we were all convinced that life would return to normal by Easter! We did not think there was any way that the virus would stick around and wreak havoc for longer than a month.

Here we are, 5+ months later, and what was considered a total upheaval of life as we knew it has now become our new “normal.” Worship services remain livestreamed, with intermittent in-person outdoor gatherings taking place as we are able. This fall’s Rally Sunday worship will be an outdoor service, with the annual Ministry Fair taking place in the parking lot instead of the Sun Hall. No matter how different things look, we will celebrate all opportunities large and small to be together in community and ministry.

Because of the limitations of COVID-19, all adult educational opportunities and faith milestone classes will be offered in a virtual setting for the foreseeable future. Just because we cannot be together in person does not mean that we cannot “gather” to learn, grow, and journey in faith! It just might look a little different than before.

Here are a few opportunities to look forward to this fall:

First Communion Class

This past spring, it was agreed upon to postpone the First Communion Class until the fall when we would hopefully be able to meet in person, but as I mentioned before, COVID-19 is sticking around much longer than anticipated.

Therefore, I am planning to offer a virtual First Communion Class on **Sunday, October 18**. We encourage all 3rd grade students and older not yet receiving the sacrament to attend this instruction time. Younger children are welcome at the discretion of their parent or guardian. Unfortunately, this class will not be able to include the option for students and parents to make their own chalices, but my goal is to provide that opportunity once we are able to gather in-person prior to celebrating First Communion in worship. The First Communion Celebration in worship will also take place once we are able to worship in-person indoors.

Children's Ministry

These cool days in August signal the coming of fall. It is one of my favorite times of year for the excitement of new things! There are new shoes, new book bags, new haircuts, new teachers, new schools, and in MN we get new apple varieties!

In Connect and SPARK you will be getting new leaders as I begin a pastoral internship in a new congregation. Much like fall, there is the sadness of leaving summer behind. I am sad to leave Crown of Glory and yet so grateful for my time with you and excited for all that will be new for you and for me! There will be a time of discernment for calling someone here to fill the role of Director of Children's Ministry. Families will have an opportunity to participate in a round table discussion about this position and around the needs of the children and families at Crown of Glory. Your voice matters. Watch for this conversation to happen in the weeks ahead.

In the interim, Pastor Laura will guide SPARK leaders and Pastor Reggie will guide the Connect leaders. All programs will be done in virtual, on-line lessons for the foreseeable future. Additional learning elements will be layered in while meeting safety considerations, like take-home bags for SPARK lessons, and service projects for Connect. Watch for updated information about these new and exciting ways to grow in faith and be a faith community together!

In Connect we have learned that groups form better bonds with one another when they have 2-4 leaders that share the role of Guide for 6 months to a full year. The consistency of leadership in the small groups enables both leaders and students to grow together in community and witness the Spirit at work among them. Prayerfully consider if God is calling you to walk with a group of our 4th or 5th graders in the year ahead. Contact Pastor Reggie for details on your role as a Connect Guide.

At the end of each summer my husband John and I always take a camping trip to one of the state parks to sleep in a tent, and eat meals cooked on a campfire. Connect Ministry

Connect is our pre-Confirmation ministry for 4th and 5th grade students where we learn about practical ways to apply our faith into our lives through biblical and historical stories.



Connect classes will be held on Wednesday evenings and all classes will be offered virtually over Zoom. Each class will be 45 minutes in length and include a large group session (25 min), from 6:00–6:25 p.m., as well as smaller virtual classrooms grouped by grade starting at 6:25–6:45 p.m. These small group sessions will be led by an adult small group guides and will review the highlights of each lesson.

Virtual Connect Orientation is scheduled for **Wednesday, September 9, from 6:00–6:30 p.m.** Online registration for Connect is available on our website at www.crownofglory.org. Our first Connect virtual class is scheduled for **Wednesday, September 16, starting at 6:00 p.m.** All registered students will receive a Zoom link via email to join in! Finally, all 4th Grade Connect students will receive a Connect Bible as they enter this new milestone of their faith journey. Our 4th Grade Connect Bible Milestone is scheduled for **Rally Sunday on September 13 at our 9:30 a.m.** outdoor worship service. 4th Grade students and their parents will be welcomed forward to receive their Bible during the service. Hello Nursery Buddies and Parents!

My plans for this fall will include writing “Nursery Nugget” blurbs in the weekly Crown Connection email that will contain fun activities and songs to help us know Jesus more. These will also include some scriptures for us to memorize together so we can carry the Word with us anywhere we go!

Confirmation Ministry


Yes! Confirmation is still happening! I am certain that by now, all of you are used to our new reality of distance learning, but I'm also sure that many of you are ready to get back to meeting in-person and experiencing a community again. I am, too! But until that time comes, Confirmation will be completely virtual, which means our classes will be a little different. Instead of having a 45-minute large group and a 40-minute small group, Confirmation will be one hour in length, beginning each Wednesday night from 6:45-7:45 p.m. Each virtual class will include a large group session that will be 30 minutes in length, from 6:45-7:15 p.m., followed by smaller virtual classroom time grouped by grade and gender from 7:15-7:45 p.m. These small group sessions will be led by Confirmation Guides and will review the highlights of each lesson.

Music and Worship

Worshipping in the Midst of a Pandemic

If 2020 is going to have a theme song, I vote for this:

*Be still, my soul, your God is on your side. Bear patiently the cross of grief or pain.
Leave to your God to order and provide, Who through all changes faithful will remain.
Be still, my soul, your best, your heavenly friend, through thorny ways leads to a joyful end.*

It must be the spirit moving among us, a God-thing, or just luck that, as the pandemic took off in March, we centered our Lenten worship on Psalm 46:10, “Be still and know that I am God.” In the past months that theme has supported us and continues to provide what I call the three P’s – perspective, patience, and perseverance.

We will need those three P’s in the coming months as we talk about beginning in-person, indoor worship again. We live in Minnesota, so outdoor worship is only an option for a limited amount of time. An indoor worship start date is out there somewhere, and I take comfort knowing our leadership is taking this issue seriously. Until then, we are limiting everyone’s Covid-19 exposure by asking the same small group of musicians, who are wearing masks and practicing physical-distancing, to lead worship.

Once we have a start date for indoor worship, and all the protocols have been established, we will begin with an in-person version of what we have been doing virtually and outside. The congregation will probably not be singing, but we will find other ways – ASL, gestures, etc.– to keep our worship, in the spirit of Lutheranism, participatory. Then we will bring in instruments – piano, violin, viola, cello, handbells etc. – that can be played with a mask, and a singer to sing the congregation’s part. Then we should be able to bring in wind instruments – flute, clarinet, saxophone, euphonium; it seems a very inefficient way to spread the virus, especially if the virus must go through a lot of tubing.

I have spent my entire career encouraging people to sing - directing choirs, teaching voice lessons, leading congregations, etc. I love telling people, “If you sing well, sing to praise the Giver. If you do not sing so well, sing to get even!” In communal singing, it is more important that we do it than do it well. It breaks my heart that we cannot all sing together. But I also understand “the blessing of abstaining from communal song,” as my colleague Gretchen Pierskalla so beautifully puts it.

Eventually Chancel Choir, Servant Song, and Chancel Chimers will return to lead worship, and we will again sing together as the people of God. What a glorious Resurrection Day that will be! I am encouraged by reading about a company in Maryland that has successfully completed early stage trials of a vaccine. Keep your fingers crossed! We will all need to be comfortable in an enclosed space.

So, if this is a way you can help your beloved community still their collective soul, bear patiently, abstain, sing differently, make music without sharing the virus, talk to me. We will need your help. Our faith has taught, and continues to teach us, that our communal perspective, patience, and perseverance will lead to a joyful end. Let us get to that indoor, in-person Resurrection Day together.

Two Years in the Making: Crown of Glory and Pulte Homes Land Exchange Completed

We sit on a V-shaped lot with the building and parking lot on the wider, flatter northern portion. The southern portion sloping down to a point is used only for storm water retention.

In June 2018, Pulte Homes approached us with a land exchange proposal. To develop the Hammer Farm property west of us, they needed access to CR 41 and proposed that we give them 8/10th acre in our southern sloped section in exchange for 3/10th acre of flatter land near our building.

Over the past two years, we negotiated that exchange of land, including just over \$99,000 to Crown of Glory. The City approved the Final Plat for Pulte and we closed on the land exchange on July 31.

Financial Corner

As we reported in the last newsletter, the Church Council and the Finance Team have been closely monitoring the status of Crown of Glory's finances during the COVID-19 pandemic and the Minnesota "Stay-at-Home" order.

In late June, Crown of Glory received a generous contribution of \$20,000 from a member family with a challenge to the congregation to match their commitment. The congregation stepped up and matched the \$20,000 gift in July. Our July contributions to our Sustaining Fund (general expenses and mortgage payments) exceeded \$88,000, a summer record for contributions! Plus, over the last few months with the building mostly shut down, our staff has been able to reduce expenses by almost \$25,000. That expense reduction, plus these gifts, helped us make up much of our deficit, as you can see with the chart below. A heartfelt thanks to all who helped the church keep up with our expenses, especially in these uncertain times!


In the last newsletter, we reviewed the status of the \$63,000 PPP Loan we received from the Federal government as part of the CARES Act. This loan is specified for payroll, mortgage and certain operational costs only. The government has extended the time we have to utilize this loan before we can apply for loan forgiveness. We are still monitoring the status of the PPP funds and will report when we have a final reckoning.

In July we also received a \$20,000 gift that was designated to our Debt Reduction fund. Currently we have no loans that are due in 2020, however, within the next 12 months we have several personal loans from our members that will come due. Including this new gift, we now have about \$120,000 in our Debt Reduction fund that will be used to pay off some of these loans. We will report on our plans in more detail as we enter 2021.

Also, on July 31, we closed the "Land Swap" deal with Pulte and received just over \$99,000. This money is being reserved for now. The Council will be considering the best options for use of the proceeds of the land swap. Number one on our list is completion of the driveway asphalt and curbing on the West side of the church. We have received a quote for that work and for the completion of the remainder of the parking lot.

The completion of the parking lot, as well as several small projects that are in planning stages, will require additional funds. Such projects include the completion of our out-building where we have our waste collection and lawn maintenance storage. The Council will be reviewing these projects in the next few weeks.

In 2020 we joined the General Operations Fund and Building Mortgage Fund to form one Sustaining Fund that provides balance and unity for our members. Gifts and donations to the Sustaining Fund support a network of ministries, our gifted staff, the day-to-day building care and upkeep, and our mortgage commitment. All gifts given to the Sustaining Fund pave the way for new ministries and new areas of growth for our future.

Building Bridges:

Crown of Glory is building new bridges in 2021. As we said "thank you and farewell" to Gretchen Pierskalla for her four years of serving as the Director of Children's Ministry, we moved into a time of reflection and discernment; not only for the future of Children's Ministry but also for calling a new Director to this position. Our pastors and staff look to gain valuable insight from our young families who have a vested interest in calling our new Director of Children's Ministry. Together we are asking the important questions: How do we make a meaningful connection to Sunday School children during a pandemic? How will we celebrate and live out faith-based milestones? What gifts and talents do we seek in a new Director of Children's Ministry? By answering these questions together, we are shaping the future for our children.

Strengthening Faith:

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, Crown of Glory has been earnestly committed to caring for one another and putting the safety of our neighbor first when it comes to limiting our in-person gatherings. At the same time, we have also been committed to providing meaningful worship experiences that strengthen the faith of all who attend. Throughout this time, we have learned new ways of being "church together," and we continue to learn new ways to strengthen our faith despite the many challenges we continue to face.
